

We offer a comprehensive 4Dx test which is a blood test that screens for four common diseases found in dogs, transmitted by ticks and mosquitos: Lyme disease, Ehrlichiosis, Anaplasmosis, and heartworm disease.

- Ticks: Ticks can spread many diseases, including Lyme disease, Ehrlichiosis, Anaplasmosis, and Rocky Mountain spotted fever, to both pets and humans. They attach to your pet's skin, feeding on blood and potentially causing tick paralysis. Ticks are often found in wooded, grassy, or densely vegetated areas

- Mosquitoes: While primarily known for their bites, mosquitoes can be external parasites and vectors for heartworm disease in dogs. Heartworms are transmitted through the bite of an infected mosquito, leading to serious heart and lung disease. It's important for pet owners to implement regular preventive measures against these parasites to protect their pets and themselves from the discomfort and health risks associated with these pests.

The 4Dx test is recommended annually for dogs, especially those in areas where ticks and mosquitos are prevalent, to ensure early detection and treatment of these diseases. This is crucial because early stages of these diseases may not present any symptoms, yet they can lead to serious health complications if left untreated.

This test requires only a small blood sample from your dog, making it a quick and low-risk procedure with minimal discomfort for the animal.

A positive result indicates exposure to one or more of the diseases tested for, but it may not necessarily mean the dog is currently suffering from the disease. Further diagnostic testing may be necessary to confirm the disease and determine the best treatment plan.
