Laser therapy, also known as photobiomodulation, uses specific wavelengths of light to interact with tissue and is proven to accelerate the healing process. It can be used to treat a variety of conditions, including acute injuries, such as sprains and strains; chronic conditions, such as arthritis; and to promote wound healing.

Many times pets with arthritis are prescribed pain management medications, which can be helpful. But not all pets are able to take pain medication due to different reasons such as:

- * Species - i.e. cats are limited in their pain management medications.

- * Organ function - i.e. patients with liver disease do not tolerate pain meds well. Patients on long term pain management medication need to have bloodwork run 1-2 times per year to check their liver function.

- * Inability to administer meds - some pets are difficult to give medication to and it can be stressful and frustrating for both the pet and owner.

- Laser therapy has an anti-inflammatory effect, helping to reduce pain without the need for pharmaceuticals.

- By stimulating cell regeneration, treatments can enhance the body's natural healing processes.

- It improves vascular activity, which can decrease swelling and enhance healing.

- Laser therapy can speed up the process of nerve cell regeneration, improving mobility in patients with nerve injuries.

- Treatments can help reduce scar tissue, leading to more complete healing.

Treatments are tailored to your pet's specific needs, considering their condition and overall health. During a laser therapy session, your pet will be fitted with protective goggles and our trained technicians will use a handheld laser that is slowly moved back and forth over the area being treated. Your pet will experience a gentle, warm sensation at the treatment site, with most treatments lasting just a few minutes. The number of sessions depends on the condition being treated but noticeable improvement is often observed after just a few treatments.
